

There is a saying, "those who live by the sword, will die by the sword." The Sermon on the mount continues as Jesus, sitting as Moses would sit, speaks the words of Moses, but with a twist in the way of understanding scripture. "You have heard it said in the past ...But, I say to you ..." These have been commonly referred to as the six antitheses. He wasn't about a new law, but a new way of life. In our lives we're not to do harm to one another. Today we extend that to all creation, and by taking these references to the commandments to an extreme He is making clear the connection between thought, language and action. The leap from anger to murder is extreme but we can get the message. The leap from thought to murder is even larger but Jesus is wanting to remind us that it is our love and not our rightness that is the more important. Matthew again reminds us, that it is "mercy, not sacrifice, that God requires."

Soon, there will be Transfiguration, and all who hear and see will be left in no doubt that Jesus is the new Moses; Jesus is the new Lawgiver; but more importantly, Jesus is the fulfilment of them both. The mountain becomes covered with cloud, the face of Jesus become radiant, and the voice of God can be paraphrased, "In the past you listened to the voice of Moses, but I say to you, this is my dear Son, listen to Him." The new listening also involves listening to the Spirit that gives life and being aware of the letter that kills. Just as Moses said, Choose Life, Jesus is saying, live Life.
