



for contemplation - following Jesus will take us to unusual places

Having grabbed our hearts by the call of his presence, this week Jesus calls us to sit at his feet on the mountain as he begins those famous, familiar phrases we have come to know as the "Beatitudes."

Popularly translated as "Happy are ... or "Blessed are ..." rather tames what are profoundly radical announcements. It is important to note that word "are" is not in the original text which makes the sentence awkward but in doing so is to give particular emphasis to the subject. One other suggestion is that the word "Honoured" reflected more clearly what Jesus is saying, particularly because he who is saying it is the Lord.

These "beatitudes" are precisely what God sees as a great contradiction to what others may see. For example we now read and hear, "How honoured the poor in spirit ..." "How honoured the meek ... " and, this honour is in the face of the dishonour of the so-called world.

As Paul would write, "God chose the things of the world that are not, and gives them honour and glory." We could say that the thread weaving its way through this honouring is the presence of kindness. It is the grand gesture of the gospel. Dare we honour what the world dis-honours; for, as Matthew is saying to us, here is the Kingdom that looks like God.

Being known by kindness is truly a sign of the presence of the kingdom of heaven. It is a declaration of what "is" as God sees.
