Message from James:_

Strange And Familiar Times (Read Luke 24:13-35)

The road to Emmaus is a familiar story but it is more importantly a familiar experience, if we allow ourselves to think about it. Out of this experience a whole movement within the church has emerged, it is called the Emmaus Walk. Some of you may have experienced this yourselves, or, know those that have.

But this road was different. This was in the days immediately after the death of Jesus and mixed with rumours and sorrows and hopes and disappointments. They walked along the road anyway.

It will have been a road they would have travelled often, wandering over the same old dust, passing the same old familiar people - even having a sense seeing without really seeing.

And, circumstances change how things look and feel.

Amid the vague and overwhelming sorrow there is a strange and familiar burning in their hearts. This is the burning you get when you are being reminded of something wonderful yet it is just escaping your recognition; this is the burning that makes you tremble with peculiar anticipation; this is the burning your heart is hoping for once again.

Jesus wants us to know that it is really Him, the same old Jesus they had come to love and trust, but He also wants them to know that this is not business as usual. Things are not going to be the same, nor would they want to be the same; familiar yes, the same never. Easter is about transformation, not about picking up where we left off and hoping for a different kind of immortality.

Make this your prayer for the end of each day.

Lord Jesus, stay with us, for evening is at hand and the day is past; be our companion in the way, kindle our hearts, and awaken hope, that we may know you as you are revealed in Scripture and the breaking of bread. Grant this for the sake of your love. Amen.
