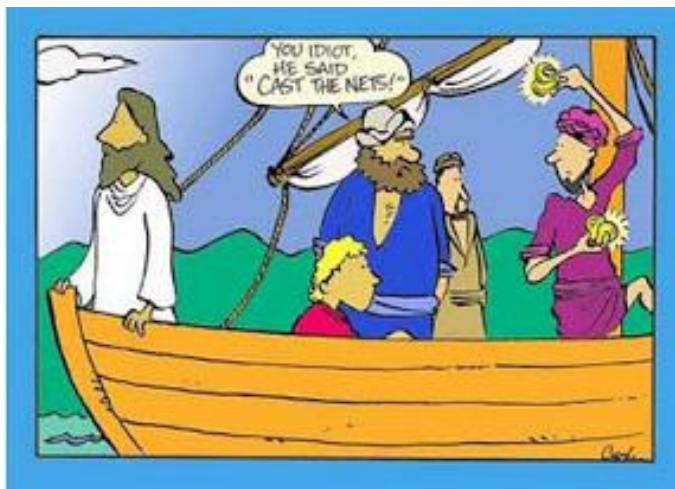

“Be Present at our Table, Lord”

In 1718 John Cennick was born into a Quaker family in London, who were immigrants from Bohemia. He lived in Reading near the Wesleys. John Wesley asked him to teach the colliers’ children in Kingswood, and he became the first Methodist lay preacher.

He eventually joined the Moravian brotherhood and worked for them in Germany as well as North Ireland.

When he was 23 he wrote:

*Be present at our table, Lord
Be here, and everywhere adored;
Thy creatures bless, and grant that we
May feast in paradise with Thee.*

In 1741 it was brought out in a book called Cennick’s Sacred Hymns for Children of God in the Days of Their Pilgrimage.
