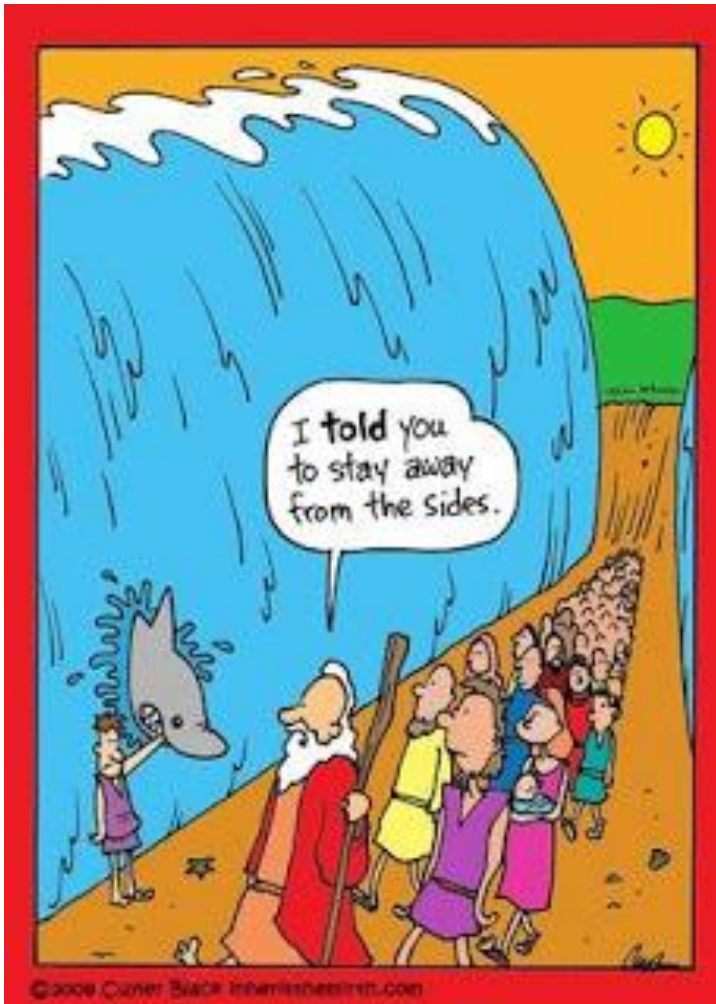

Funeral for Rev Dr Clive Krohn

Clive served as a minister in north Queensland and Brisbane before serving as College Principal at Methodist Training College and Bible School, and later Master of Cromwell College at the University of Queensland from 1975–1995. He was a highly regarded and much loved leader in the Uniting Church.



Blue Card update

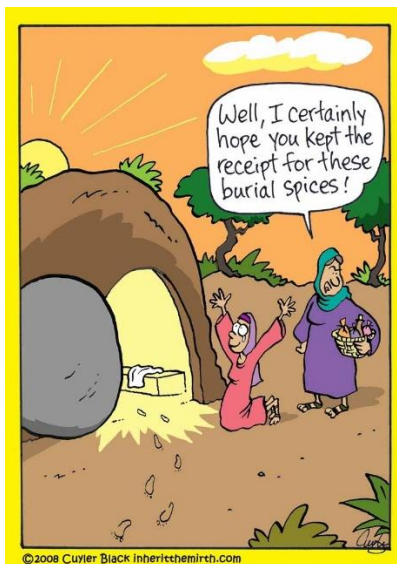
No card, no start: from 31 August 2020 will mean that paid workers must have a blue card (not just a pending application) before they can start working with children.

People with paid applications in progress when the policy starts can continue working while their application is assessed.

Volunteers, trainee students and people running regulated child-related businesses already need a blue card before they can start working with children.

If you don't apply to renew your card before it expires, you will be subject to the no card, no start policy and will not be able to continue working or volunteering until a new blue card has been issued.

The Synod office will undertake the necessary changes in relation to emails we send to ministry agents to reflect the changes about renewing a blue card prior to expiry.



“O GOD OUR HELP IN AGES PAST”

Isaac Watts composed this hymn in 1714, during a time of national anxiety as to the succession to the throne. Queen Anne was nearing the end of her reign. She had no direct heir. Her family of eight had all died at birth. Her husband had pre-deceased her by eight years. Her friendships had proved unhappy, and she was disillusioned and lonely.

The queen had served her country well. She had been moderate, a stout-hearted Protestant, thoughtful for her people, generous and kindly, establishing out of her own pocket the renowned “Queen Anne’s Bounty.” She built many churches. Her people called her “Good Queen Anne.”

Comparisons of the Queen’s personality with that of George of Hanover, the heir apparent, did not work to the latter’s advantage, and a general concern and foreboding was felt at the prospect of a man who could speak no English and knew little or nothing of English ways occupying the English throne.

Isaac Watts, a guest at the home of Sir Charles and Lady Abney, wrote this hymn to calm the nation’s fears. It was published in leaflet form and distributed widely.

Six years later, Croft, the famous organist of Westminster Abbey composed the majestic tune (1720).

*O God; our help in ages past,
Our hope for years to come,
Our shelter from the stormy blast,
And our eternal home.*

*Beneath the shadow of Thy throne
Thy saints have dwelt secure;
Sufficient is Thine arm alone,
And our defence is sure.*

Before the hills in order stood,

*Or earth received her frame,
From everlasting Thou art God
To endless years the same.*

*A thousand ages in Thy sight
Art like an evening gone;
Short as the watch that ends the night,
Before the rising sun.*

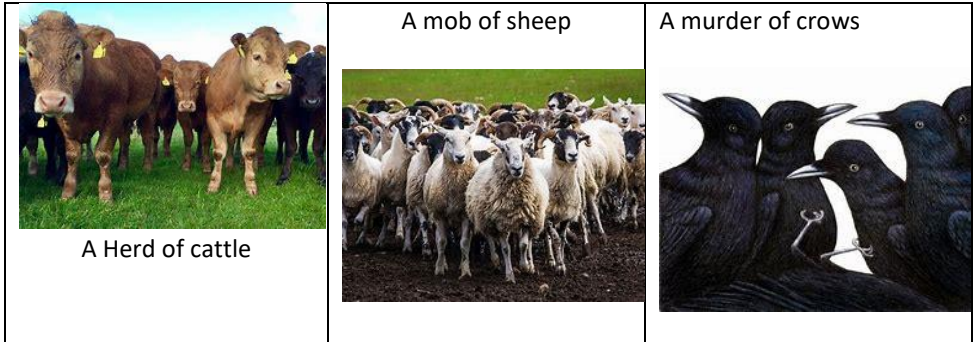
*Time, lie an ever-rolling stream,
Bears all its sons away;
They fly, forgotten, as a dream
