




TODAY CRY OUT TO JESUS

'Many warned him to be quiet; but he cried out all the more." (Mark 10:48)

Try to imagine being blind all your life, then one day miraculously receiving your sight. And the first face you see - is the face of Jesus! That's what happened to Bartimaeus. Jesus was passing by the spot where he sat begging every day. Recognising this was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, he cried out for help at the top of his lungs. Sometimes dignified prayer won't get the job done. Desperate situations call for desperate measures. Sometimes you've got to cry out to God from the depths of your soul! "Jesus stood still" (Mark 10:49) when Baritimaeus shouted. Your cry will get God's attention. David said, 'O Lord my God, I cried out to You, and You healed me.' (Psalm 30:2) Don't be reluctant, be confident. 'Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.' (Hebrews 4:18). The Bible says, 'Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to Jesus.' (Mark 19:50). He did that for two reasons: first, a long robe could have tripped him as a beggar. To get to Jesus, you must be willing to throw aside everything that stands in your way. The shame and failure of your past, your lack and limitations, the labels other people have put on you. When Jesus restores and makes you whole, you won't have to wear those old garments anymore. And here's another thought: when Bartimaeus regained his sight, he decided to follow Jesus (see Mark 10:52), and you must do that too.

Information on our proposed "first service after Lockdown" on **Sunday** 13th September.

Legislation prohibits more than 50 attending the service, so we will need to **individually register** an 'intention to attend', with Neville phone: **54506148** or email <u>nevilletenor@gmail.com</u> So that we do not exceed 50 attendees. If you plan to intend PLEASE let Neville know.

To ensure this goes ahead we have to satisfy Covid-19 guidelines (and document these), and so need to restart our Fellowship of Fixing from **Thursday 27th August** -Sweeping, vacuuming, etc inside; and mowing, sweeping leaves, tidying outside. Please consider helping if you can.

The church must also be sanitised **before and after** <u>every</u> gathering whether 10 people attend or 100 attend. Bev Lacey is coordinating the sanitising for the church service on 13th. She will need two teams.... (a BEFORE CHURCH team, and an AFTER CHURCH team), so that the church is sanitized for the Korean service, after our 8:30 service. She will need volunteers by about 7:30 till 8:30 for the BEFORE TEAM and 9:30 till 10:30 for the AFTER CHURCH team, and she will need to know your availability before the 10th September. Each Team member will have access to disposable gloves, and sanitizer. If you can help with sanitizing please let Bev know which team you can help with.

To give you an idea of what is entailed Covid-wise with a church service, here are some of the requirements: All pews, seats, back rests, arm rests, any tables, and benches used must be disinfectant sprayed before and after Church.

The following items must all be sanitized with disinfectant sprayed on a clean cloth and wiped down before and after the service:

Door handles, Electrical switches, handrails, microphones and music stands, any pens, computers used, hand sanitizer, etc that have been touched

The Service: Those attending the church service are asked to bring your own pen to sign the attendance register. There will be one entrance and one exit to the church. Offering plates will be placed at entrance doors, to limit contact with money. There will be no tea, coffee or food served. We believe, though, that we will be able to congregate in the car park, after church, as long as social distancing is observed.

So to summarize

Please remember to let Bev know if you can help with cleaning the church for Covid before and after our service on 13 September on 5445 6279. If you can help with grounds and normal cleaning of the church (on Thursday mornings), please let Neville know on 5450 6148. Please notify him if you intend to attend on the 13th. If you are considered vulnerable by the Covid rules, please tell us when you ring so I can carry out Risk Management procedures with you. It is

important you tell us because I cannot ask a lady her age! For details, please see the letter you received recently.

The service on 13 September will be at 8.30am and led by Rev Allan Kuchler. The offering should be placed in the plates near the entry door and will be dedicated during the service. You are welcome to wear protective gear such as mask or gloves if you wish. At the service we will have to decide when to hold a congregational meeting but it will not be on that day as we must give two Sundays notice.
