








And the good news is:drum roll please.....



The WMP House is full! All 9 rooms have been allocated, as well as being fully staffed and functioning!




Rumour has it that James, Doug and Russ set a cracking pace as they enjoy their walk around the block every week.

Jan Rossow reverted to her inner child, as usual, when the camera appeared. For evidence please see exhibit A...



"JESUS BIDS US SHINE"

Susan Warner, was born in New York in 1819. Her father, a well-to-do lawyer, gave his two children (Susan and Ann) a good education to fit them for the social activities of the times. But the sisters, being of a literary turn of mind, exercised their talent in a practical way by teaching in Sunday School.

Their father died suddenly, and left them penniless. The girls at once started writing to keep the home going, choosing Bible stories as subjects, with characters out of the Old Testament. These had a wide sale, and others were in demand.

Financial problems were not immediately solved, but neither Susan or Ann allowed this to dampen their deep trust in God. Then Susan's book was published, an instant success. It became the next best seller to *Uncle Tom's Cabin*.

Susan published at least 5 other books, besides religious small books for young people. And not the least of her works, was the following hymn.

Jesus bids us shine
With a clear, pure light,
Like a little candle
Burning in the night.
In this world of darkness; So we must shine,
You in your small corner, And I in mine.

Jesus bids us shine,
First of all for Him;
Well He sees and knows it,
If our light grows dim;

He looks down from heaven and so sees us shine, You in your small corner, and I in mine.

Jesus bids us shine,
Then, for all around;
Many kinds of darkness
In the word are found.
Sin and want, and sorrow: So we must shine
You in your small corner, And I in mine.

Susan died when she was 66 and was buried at West Point, nor far from her home where most of her books were written and where she had a Bible class for the cadets of the US Military Academy.
