Good afternoon Maroochydore (+ Nat, Chris and Stuart),

There have been some good conversations about "where to next?" for the Church in Maroochydore, including some response to the sermons you've heard and perhaps to the milestone of James's 'closure' service.

This Sunday Rev. Kath Behan will bring the message, but there seems to be good support for an all-members meeting (instead of a worship service) on the 21st March. It would be good timing to achieve two key things, on the way to a discussion with Presbytery about how Maroochydore is progressing, mid-year.

There are questions emerging about how, when and the cost of calling another minister. There are also questions about repairs to your building. The former is three steps away. The latter is not the Mission Engagement Officer's expertise, but I am confident it's in hand with the Presbytery and Synod property folk. (*I will do my best to bring you an update on that.*)

Natalie Roy and I are happy to come and work alongside you on the 21st as you handle the two matters:

1)The first is quite straight forward and without it, Maroochydore isn't able to move ahead as a local Uniting Church entity. <u>The whole 'membership' needs to</u> <u>appoint</u> a small leadership team. It's not a "church council". It is a <u>recognised and</u> <u>authorised group</u> who for **(I suggest) twelve months** continues in the basic leadership roles you are shouldering, and provides the voice of Maroochydore in discussions with Presbytery.

A chair, treasurer and secretary are the minimum, a fourth member would spread the load.

Your 'Faith Community' (as Maroochydore is now) is also welcome to a representative at Presbytery.

2)The second matter is work we can begin on the 21st, and something that must be clear to the whole church before any discussions about how to grow the church, when to call a new minister, what that costs... even your relationship with the Korean community. - Natalie and I would ask everyone a <u>big double-</u> <u>barrelled</u> question. Why does Maroochydore (town) need a Uniting Church? Why do you (each individual) want to be a part of that?

The question is not, "How/Why do I want this church's Sunday services to continue?" You'll cross those bridges once you have your answer to why your surrounding community needs you. Natalie and I are happy to then work with you in the months ahead. As with Uniting Churches from Nanango to Childers, you can assess what resources you have, your peoples' passions and the needs around you - to shape a new life of Worship, Community and Mission.

So, if you're open to this, let me know and we'll give Scott Guyatt the weekend at home in Brisbane .

On the 21st you'll need ballot papers and a simple minute to be recorded, appointing those leaders, to those roles, for a period. That decision would be sent to the Presbytery Secretary for Mary Burnett's records.

A white board would helpful if you have one, and I would suggest a note in the newsletter, letting members know and asking that they bring a pen and notepad.
