

“ALL GLORY, LAUD, AND HONOUR”

St. Theodulph of Orleans was born in Italy about the year 779. As a young man he entered a monastery. His learning, diplomacy and skill marked him for advancement, and he became abbot.

During these turbulent times soldiers ruled the street, and fighting was an everyday event. Abbot Theodulph was sought as a mediator of the different factions. He came to the notice of Charlemagne, who thought so highly of him that when he returned to France, he took Theodulph with him and made him Bishop of Orleans.

This appointment caused a lot of jealousy, and nasty rumours about his loyalty led to his imprisonment in a monastery for three years.

On Palm Sunday of 821 A.D. King Louis and his retinue were on their way to church. Passing the prison they heard joyful singing and reined in their steeds to listen. It was Theodulph, singing through the bars of his window the hymn he had composed for that day. The King's heart was softened by such fervour and turned to his Knights and declared "this Bishop is no traitor!" He ordered his release at once and restored him to royal favour.

Theodulph died soon after, leaving this eloquent hymn of praise for Palm Sundays. Eleven hundred years later it was translated from Latin and soon found in most hymn books.

*All glory, laud and honour,
To Thee redeemer King.
To whom the lips of children
Made sweet hosannahs ring.*

*Thou art the King of Israel,
Thou David's royal Son,
Who in the Lord's name comest
The King and Blessed One.*

*The company of angels
Are praising Thee on high
And mortal men and all things
Created make reply*

*The people of the Hebrews
With palms before Thee went;
Our praise and prayer and anthems
Before Thee we present.*

*To thee before Thy passion,
They sang their hymns of praise;
To Thee now high exalted,
Our melody we raise.*

*Thou didst accept their praises;
Accept the prayers we bring,
Who in all good delighted,
Thou good and gracious King.*

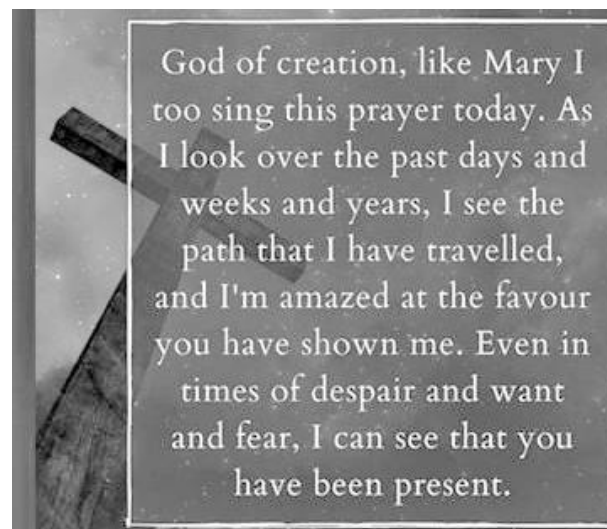
