This one morning in the year we reserved to refresh the reader's memory upon the subject of prayer for ministers, and we earnestly implore every Christian to answer the fervent request of the words first written by the apostle and now repeated by us. A very heavy responsibility rests upon every minister of the Gospel, and it will be no small mercy if at the last they are found clean of the blood of all people.752 As officers in Christ's army, they are the special mark of the enmity of people and demons.
