Reflection - What is in your Hand?

Have you ever been tapped on the shoulder and found yourself with no choice other than saying YES, even though kicking and screaming, your reluctance raised more questions than answers - particularly around your inadequacies for the job?

In the book of Exodus, Moses is being called by God for a tough assignment that requires him to go back into a hostile and life-threatening environment to the very place that he has fled for the last 40 years. God gives him assurance of His faithfulness and that he will not be abandoned by giving him 3 signs. The first sign was that God instructed Moses to throw down the walking stick that was in his hand. And when he did that, the stick turned into a snake, and Moses jumped back. Then God invited him to pick the stick up by the tail. And when Moses did this, the snake turned back into a walking stick.

When I reflect on this sign, I wonder - what is in our hands that God is inviting us to throw down? This stick was not just a walking stick, it represented all that was precious to Moses. It was a tool of his trade as a Shepherd, it was his livelihood, it was everything that was familiar to him; a safe place as a refugee in a foreign country, his security, the life he had built for himself, the family business. After all... he had responsibilities.

God was inviting him to throw it all down and put his trust in him as the God who is “I AM” - before all things and beyond all things. I am also wondering - what is God inviting us to pick up? It might be as risky or have as much bite as a snake. It might be counter-logical or defy everything that we have known but be the very calling that God has on our life for the next season.

Jesus says, unless you are prepared to come with the faith and acceptance of a child, you will not experience what it means to be part of my kingdom, you will not get to share in all that I have planned for you. The very thing that we hold onto firmly, may be the thing that will get in our way or continue to be a distraction. The very thing we are afraid to pick up, may be the thing that God is offering us, and asking of us- the thing we need for what God has planned for us, for life in all its fullness.

So what is in our hands? And what is God asking us to take hold of? Let us listen for God’s guidance and act upon his invitation and his instruction with faith and hope. **Rev Bruce Moore - Moderator**
