Christ delights to think upon His Church and look upon her beauty. As the bird returns to her nest, and as the traveler hastens home, so the mind continually pursues the object of its choice. We can never look too often at the one we love – our Lord Jesus. From all eternity He has been "rejoicing in His whole world and delighting in mankind." His thoughts looked forward to the time when His elect would be born into the world: He viewed them in the mirror of His foreknowledge.
