#### Stand on God's Word

"I have blotted out "your transgressions, and "your sins" (Is 44:22

#### When you have a hard time forgiving yourself.

There is only one unpardonable sin named in the Bible (See Luke 12:10), and, as a believer, you probably haven't committed it, so God will forgive you for everything else. However, when God says He forgives you and you refuse to forgive yourself, it's like opting to stay in prison after the judge has expunged your record and set you free. And worse, you're committing the sin of pride. How come? Because when God forgives you, and you refuse to forgive yourself, you're putting your opinion above His.

If you're having trouble forgiving yourself, stand on God's Word: "I, even I, am He who blots out your transgressions for My own sake; and I will not remember your sins' (Is 43:25). "I have blotted out like a thick cloud, your transgressions, and like a cloud, your sins. Return to Me, for I have redeemed you (Is 44:22). 'Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, and He will have mercy on him; and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon' (Is 55:7). "...never open your mouth anymore because of your shame, when I provide you an atonement for all you have done" says the Lord God" (Ex 16:63). 'If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness' (1 John 1:9). 'There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the spirit' (Rom 8:1).

Are you in Christ Jesus? Then rejoice you no longer need to struggle under the weight of condemnation. God has totally forgiven you, so forgive yourself and move on.
