Mere infants in Christ. (1 Corinthians 3:1)

Are you mourning, believer, because you're so weak in the divine life—because your faith is so little. and your love so feeble? Cheer up, for you have cause for gratitude. In some things you're equal to the greatest and most full-grown Christians. You're as much bought with blood as they are. You're as much an adopted child of God as any other believer. An infant is as truly a child of its parents as is the full-grown adult. You are as completely justified, for your justification is not a thing of degrees. Your little faith has made you every bit as clean. You have as much right to the precious things of the covenant as the most advanced believers, for your right to covenant mercies lies not in your growth but in the covenant itself. Your faith in Jesus is not the measure of your inheritance in Him, but the token of it. You're as rich as the richest, if not in enjoyment, yet in real possession. In the family register of glory, the small and the great are written with the same pen. You're as dear to your Father's heart as the greatest in the family. Jesus is very tender over you. You're like a bruised reed, and He will never break the bruised reed. 1169 Instead of being downcast by reason of what you are, you should triumph in Christ. In Him I'm made to sit in heavenly places. 1170 Am I poor in faith? Still in Jesus I'm heir of all things. I will rejoice in the Lord, and glory in the God of my salvation.
