And then finally, he said, "And if I had all the whiskey in the world, I'd take it and throw it into the river."


He sat down. The song leader then stood very cautiously and announced with a smile, "For our closing song, let us sing Hymn # 365: "Shall We Gather at the River."

The camp of Dan brought up the rear when the armies of Israel were on the march. The Danites occupied the last place, but they were as much part of the host as were the foremost tribes. They followed the same fiery pillar, 789 ate the same manna, 790 drank from the same spiritual rock,⁷⁹¹ and journeyed to the same inheritance. Cheer up my heart, though last and least it's your privilege to be in the army, and to fare as those fare who lead. Some one must be last in honor and esteem, some one must do menial work for Jesus, and why not me? Danites occupy a very useful place. Stragglers have to be picked up during the march, and lost property has to be gathered from the field. Fiery spirits may dash forward over untrodden paths to learn fresh truth, and may win more souls to Jesus, but those of a more conservative spirit are often used to remind the Church of her ancient faith and restore her fainting sons and daughters. 792 Every position has its duties, and the slower moving children of God will find their peculiar state one in which they may eminently bless the whole host. The rear guard is a place of danger. There are foes behind us as well as before us. Attacks come from all directions. Amalek fell upon Israel793 and slew all those who were lagging behind. Weary Christians must not be left unaided, and therefore it's the duty of experienced saints to bear their standards among the last. My soul, tenderly watch to help today those who are last.
