How to prevent your kids from  
borrowing the car...



*I will tell of the kindnesses of the LORD, the deeds  
for which He is to be praised, according to all the  
LORD has done for us.  
(Isaiah 63:7)*

Can you do this? Are there mercies that you *have experienced*? Even though you are gloomy now, can you forget that blessed hour when Jesus met you and said, "Come to me"?<sup>53</sup> Can you remember that rapturous moment when He broke your slavery to sin,<sup>54</sup> and said, "I came to break your bonds and set you free"? Or if you've forgotten the love you felt when you were wedded to Christ, there must surely be some precious milestone along the road of life not quite grown over with moss, on which you can read a happy memorial of His mercy towards you? Were you ever sick before and He restored you? Were you ever without before and He supplied your needs? Were you ever in difficulties before and He delivered you? Get up then and go to the river of your experience, and pull up a few papyrus [bulrushes] and braid them into an ark, in which your childlike faith may float safely on the stream.<sup>55</sup> Don't forget what your God has done for you. Look through the pages of your memory and think about your past. Has God never helped you in time of need? I know He has. Go back, then, a little ways to the choice mercies of yesterday, and though all may be dark *now*, light up the lamps of your past. They will shine through the darkness, and you will trust in the Lord until the day breaks and the shadows flee away. "Remember, O LORD, Your great mercy and love, for they are from of old."<sup>56</sup>
